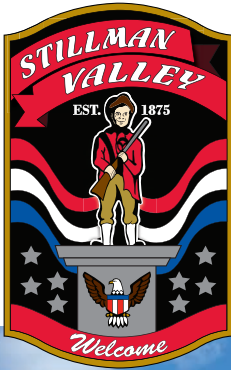

Welcome to the 89th Annual Stillman Valley Fall Festival presented by Stillman Bank! During the weekend of Sept. 26-27, Stillman Valley is transformed into this exciting family-friendly event. Best of all, admission is free!

The committee has been working hard to get the Festival ready.. The Pickleball event is being sponsored by Kishwaukee Community Church and will be in the west parking lot by Jr. High. We continued working to build a Kid Zone and we extended the Zone to 6 pm. There will still be a side-by-side obstacle course for larger kids and a small bounce house for the younger kids. We have more games this year and have decided to have an entry fee to enter the Kid Zone. The wristband will allow entry and exit. This way kids can come and go during the Kid Zone time.

New Events this year: We are bringing back the Kids Pedal Pull! This event will be on Saturday on the East side of the Jr High. Free this year! Many of the existing events are planned throughout the weekend, including an Antique Tractor & Steam Engine Show, Car Show, Indoor Craft Show, Horticulture Show, and some Live Music. THE SILENT AUCTION IS A CAN'T MISS EVENT!

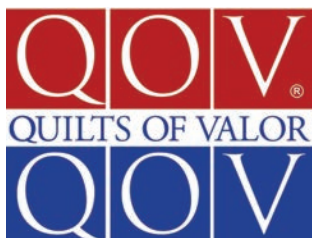

QUILT OF VALOR PRESENTATION



What is a Quilt of Valor?

A Quilt of Valor® (QOV) is a quality, handmade quilt that is machine or hand quilted. It is awarded to a member or veteran of the US Armed Services to show our appreciation for the service and sacrifice of they have made by serving our Country and protecting our freedoms. The Quilt says unequivocally, "Thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation."

To use the term Quilt of Valor, Quilts of Valor or QOV, the quilt must be a specific size, must have a label with required information, it must be awarded (it is not a gift) and it must be recorded. Over 450,000 quilts have been awarded by the Quilts of Valor® Foundation.

We honor these veterans this year at 11 am on Saturday, Sept 26 on the Fall Festival Stage.

PARADE ROUTE

(See page 7 for map)



The parade route begins by leaving the High School parking lot on South Pine and continues North on Pine Street for five blocks, then going East on Main Street. It continues on Main Street to Meridian Road. The Parade will officially end when it gets past Route 72. The return route to the high school will be along Meridian Road to the east entrance of the high school and back to the parking lot. Groups may stop and disperse at the intersection of Pershing and Meridian.

Due to safety concerns from the officers directing traffic, all parade participants must continue across Route 72 onto Meridian to reunite with family and friends.

IF YOU ARE IN THE PARADE AND GOING TO THE HIGH SCHOOL: The road in front of the High school is closed for safety reasons. All parade entries that are gathering at the High School should use the back entrance to register for the parade. If you are dropping someone off that is going to participate in the parade, you can park in the back by the baseball fields or drop them off at Highland school. The only traffic past the check-in point will be entries in the parade. Again this is for the safety of all the entries in the parking lot.

ANNUAL GRAIN AND HORTICULTURE SHOW



See the work of the areas top "Green Thumbs"!

The Stillman Valley FFA Chapter in cooperation with the Stillman Valley Lions Club will again sponsor a Grain and Horticulture Show at this year's Fall Festival. The show will be held Saturday, at the Meridian Junior High

School. Entries will be accepted on Saturday, from 7:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. only.

Judging will be from 10:30 a.m. until approximately noon. Judging will be closed to the public. Cash prizes and ribbons will be given to the top three exhibits in each category. Exhibitors will be limited to one entry per category. Vegetables should be exhibited on a paper plate.

Classes to be judged are as follows, Vegetables: (vegetables are to be exhibited on a paper plate) 1 Acorn Squash, 1 Butternut Squash, 3 ears sweet corn, 5 lima beans, 10 green beans, 10 wax beans, 5 beets, 1 Green Cabbage, 1 Red Cabbage, 1 Cabbage-largest head, 5 carrots, 5 Brussel Sprouts, 5 cucumbers, 1 Eggplant, 1 Muskmelon, 5 White Onions, 5 Red Onions, 5 Yellow Onions, 5 Parsnips, 3 Peppers, 5 Red Potatoes, 5 White Potatoes, 1 Pie Pumpkin, 1 Pumpkin Largest, 5 Tomatoes, 1 Summer Squash, 5 Turnips, Most Unusual Vegetable, 5 Okra, 5 of any small vegetable not listed above, 1 of any large vegetable not listed above.

Best Display of Garden Vegetables: This includes at least 7 vegetables from the listed vegetables above.

Fruits: 10 Red Raspberries, 5 Whitney Crabs, 5 Red Delicious Apples, 5 Golden Delicious Apples, 5 Any other variety of apple, 5 Plums, 5 Pears, 5 peaches, 1 Bunch Grapes, 1 of any fruit not listed above.

Grain: 1 Gallon Shelled Corn, 1 Gallon Soybeans, 1 Gallon Oats, 1 Gallon Wheat, 1 Gallon of any other grain not listed above, 10 Ears of Old Corn, Best Stalk of Corn, Best Stalk of Soybeans

Forage: Sample of Grass Hay, Sample of Alfalfa Hay, Sample Of Mixed Hay, Sample of Straw any variety, Sample of any other forage not listed above.

Flowers: Cut Flowers, Hanging Baskets, Roses, African Violets, Foliage Plants, Glads, House Plants, Arrangements. Any flower that is grown by the entrant is eligible to be shown. Classes will be formed at the show.

Ribbons and prize money will be distributed to entrants immediately following the parade on Sunday. Entries that are not picked up by 5 p.m. will be discarded.
